
## *Noisy Collection on Sunday, May 7*

- to discover new opportunities for greater commitments and deeper involvement in the work God has prepared for us to do

- Proposals are now welcome from or through Trinity members.
- Past years' grant recipients are eligible to apply again this year.
- Proposals must be completed using the application form, either in hard copy or electronically.
- Proposals can be submitted by email, online, or hard copy to the Trinity office.
- Since the budget is limited, please only submit one application per member.
- A small group of Trinity members will prayerfully consider the applications and seek the Holy Spirit's guidance in determining the awards.
- Applications are due by May 31, 2017.
- Awards will be made by June 30, 2017.
- Information on the outcome of the projects or program is not required, but is encouraged.



Assessment for men and women. Being proactive about your health by knowing your risks helps you and your doctor address problems early.


