## Reading Overview

Today we mark the end of the Church Year with the celebration of the Festival of Christ the King. Our focus is on the Kingdom of God—both present and future. Our first lesson points to a future “shepherd king” who will save his flock after the manner of the Old Testament shepherd king, David. Christians believe that this prophecy is fulfilled in Jesus Christ. The second lesson from Ephesians 1 speaks of Christ in his state of exaltation ruling over the universe along with God the Father. The Father “put all things under his feet and gave him as head over all things to the church” (Ephesians 1:22). The Gospel lesson for Christ the King is taken from Jesus’ end times discourse in Matthew 24-25. Jesus describes how his “sheep” will be known by their simple acts of hospitality and compassion. May we daily acknowledge Christ to be the King of Kings and Lord of Lords in our lives! .


