## Second Lesson ..... 1 Corinthians 15:1-11 (ESV)

Now I would remind you, brothers, of the gospel I preached to you, which you received, in which you stand, and by which you are being saved, if you hold fast to the word I preached to you—unless you believed in vain.

For I delivered to you as of first importance what I also received: that Christ died for our sins in accordance with the Scriptures, that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures, and that he appeared to Cephas, then to the twelve. 





## Music Notes for Easter Day

**"The Appian Way" from *Pines of Rome* by Ottorino Respighi** is perhaps one of the most exhilarating works in all classical music. While most of his musical studies were undertaken in Italy, Respighi spent two crucial years in Russia where he took lessons in orchestration from Nikolay Rimsky-Korsakov and developed a masterful technique in the use of instrumental colors and sonorities. The English horn starts with a haunting melody which eventually gives way to resplendent brass fanfares under an insistent rhythmic foundation. May its relentless energy and emerging spiritual power prepare your heart to receive the message of the musical journey which follows: Christ is risen indeed! Alleluia!

**Alleluia by Ben A. Spalding** was written especially for today's Easter celebration! The work is in A-B-A form and begins with a broad section with rich harmonic sonorities stated by the choir and key rhythmic interjections by the orchestra. The middle section is a lively mixed-meter dance which resembles the work of Leonard Bernstein in honor of the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of his birth this year. The broad section returns at the end with even more harmonically dense chord clusters that eventually end with a glorious resolution to D major.

**Christ is Risen! Shout Hosanna!** is an ideal hymn for Easter Sunday because it discusses the resurrection of Christ and the promise and changes that this powerful act will bring. The text was written in 1984 by Dr. Brian Wren, a British hymn writer, and is paired with Beethoven's HYMN TO JOY. Dr. Wren says that "Easter joy" is an "action for justice." We, as Christians, can find peace in Christ's resurrection, and can overcome evil.

**In Thee Is Gladness arr. Daniel Kallman** is a joyful syncopated setting of the well-known Easter tune set here with a strongly punctuated accompaniment. The melody gets a surprise treatment between stanzas in the form of whistling! The recent addition of orchestra adds new colors that are highly effective.

**"Thine Is the Glory"** is a French hymn written in 1884 by Edmond Louis Budry, pastor of Free Church congregations in Cully and Vevey, Switzerland. The tune was composed by George Frideric Handel and comes from his oratorio *Judas Maccabeus*.

**"Hallelujah" (from *Christ on the Mount of Olives*), by Ludwig von Beethoven** was composed during the summer of 1801. It took less than three weeks to complete and is the earliest of his three major choral works. It is a much more personal portrayal of Christ in the Garden of Gethsemane than works by previous classical artists. During this time, Beethoven was in a tortured state of increasing deafness, perhaps the greatest tragedy for a composer. So, by the time *Christ on the Mount of Olives* was composed, Beethoven was almost entirely deaf. "Hallelujah Chorus" is an elegant piece that has been recorded and performed by choirs around the globe.


