If we do not know where we are going, how do we know if we get there?

Chances are you have belonged to an organization with a mission statement. And chances are you cannot remember what that mission was. You may have a vague idea of the organization's purpose or remember key parts of the mission, but you probably cannot recite the mission statement of the organization.

At Trinity Lutheran Church Preschool, our mission is: Trinity Lutheran Church Preschool supports the family by nurturing the growth of young children through developmentally appropriate experiences in a Christian environment.

Any clear school mission statement should be able to answer questions like: What is our purpose? What are we supposed to be doing? What collective

commitments have we made? Is it clear what we stand for? But answering those questions is only the beginning. How do we know if we are fulfilling our mission?

Each year, the preschool asks parents to complete a questionnaire. The questionnaire allows parents

to rate the school's effectiveness in multiple areas, share their favorite things about the school, suggest changes, and describe the preschool using three words. Responses are tallied, and then comes the moment of truth...are we fulfilling our mission? Here is a snapshot of this year's results:

2016-17 Parent Questionnaire Results




I recommend Trinity to friends and family searching for a preschool.



Retirement Workshop Resources



Boundaries



The Legacy Journey





Confession and Forgiveness: Professing Faith As Ambassadors of Reconciliation



Cultivating Lifestyles of Reconciliation



include: Carotid Artery (plaque buildup-a leading cause of stroke), Abdominal Aortic Aneurysm (an enlargement or weak area in the main blood vessel that carries blood from the heart to the rest of the body), Peripheral Arterial Disease (hardening of the arteries in the legs), a Heart Rhythm Screening (an EKG to detect Atrial Fibrillation-irregular heartbeat) and an Osteoporosis Risk

Assessment for men and women. Being proactive about your health by knowing your risks helps you and your doctor address problems early.


Walk for Life - June 3
