Top coat seal and striping will occur **September 22**. This is expected to take one day. Of course this activity is dependent on weather, so


we will not know the specific day until much closer to the activity. The church office will connect with the groups that have events scheduled for the day(s) we expect the parking lot to be off-limits.








500th Anniversary Festival at Bethlehem-Raymore
