Reading Overview

The Festival of All Saints is dedicated to the remembrance of all those who have gone before us who have died in the faith. Like many congregations, Trinity specifically remembers those of our faith family who have died in Christ over the past 12 months. The focus of the Scripture readings is on the certain hope that is ours because of God's love for us in Jesus Christ. The first reading from Revelation 7 is a portion of John's vision of heaven describing a "great multitude" from all nations and people groups standing before the throne of the Lamb of God. This diverse group has one thing in common: "they have washed their robes and made them white in the blood of the Lamb" (Revelation 7:14). The Epistle lesson from 1 John 3 reminds us that God has claimed us as His own and that we are called "children of God." Our joyous hope is that "when he is revealed, we will be like him, for we will see him as he is" (1 John 3:2). The Gospel lesson from Matthew 5 consists of the familiar words of the Beatitudes. Because we are in Christ, we are blessed—not always in ways recognized by the world around us. Precious in the eyes of the Lord is the death of his saints!





Music Note: British composer Simon Preston (1938-) served as organist of Westminster Abbey and Christ Church, Oxford, before focusing on a concert career. Written without a key signature or meter indications, his Alleluyas (1965) is probably his best-known piece. Most of the musical material grows out of two contrasting musical ideas—a quick, rhythmic melody, and a series of chromatic chords. The following quote is found at the top of the musical score:

*At his feet the six-winged Seraph; Cherubim with sleepless eye,


