


# Palm Sunday

## Reading Overview

Today marks the beginning of Holy Week. In our first lesson, the prophet Zechariah prophesies centuries before Jesus' triumphal entry that he would be riding into Jerusalem on a donkey. Zechariah calls the people to a joyful response because "your king is coming to you; righteous and having salvation . . ." (Zechariah 9:9). Our second lesson focuses our attention on the passion of our Lord Jesus, who humbled himself and became obedient to death on a cross. As a result, God the Father exalted him and raised him to the highest place. As followers of Jesus, we are also called to humble ourselves in service to God and others. Today's Gospel lesson is Mark's account of Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem on the first Palm Sunday. Today we join the crowds in proclaiming: "Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord!" (Mark 11:10). May God bless your Holy Week.

**Nursery Available:** We love children at Trinity and are so pleased you and your children are worshipping with us today! We firmly believe the most important people influencing the faith formation of a child are found in the home - parents, grandparents, guardians. One of the key ways children learn about God is by watching their parents worship. We encourage you to keep your children with you in church to worship as a family. We also offer a staffed nursery for children 6 months to 3 years of age. At Mission, the nursery is staffed during the 9:45am and 11am services and available to parents at 8:30am. The Mission nursery is around the corner from the Sanctuary. At Shawnee, the nursery is staffed from 8:30-noon downstairs in room 103.

*Today we begin the observance of Holy Week, the most important week in the liturgical year for Christians. During Holy Week, we retrace the footsteps of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. We shout "Hosanna!" as he rides into Jerusalem on a donkey. We see him in the upper room washing his disciples' feet and instituting Holy Communion for his disciples and the church. We are there with him in the garden, seeking to watch and pray. We see him betrayed, arrested, put on trial, mocked, scourged, and sentenced to die. We see and hear the nails driven into his hands and feet. We stand at the foot of the cross and witness the agony of his suffering and death. We see his lifeless body laid in a tomb and the stone rolled in front to seal the entrance. And finally, we go early to the tomb and see that the stone has been rolled away, and we hear the message of the angels, "He is not here; for he has been raised, as he said."*

*During the course of this Holy Week, his story again becomes our story. He died and rose again, breaking the power of death for us. So we too will be raised bodily by the power of God. May God bless you this Holy Week!*





# Holy Week Services

## Maundy Thursday



**Noon and 7pm, Mission Campus:** Join us before worship for a light middle-eastern style buffet starting an hour before each service as we remember the Passover meal celebrated by Jesus and His disciples and by all of Judaism since the Exodus. Following the buffet, we gather for a solemn service commemorating the Last Supper. Communion is celebrated, the altar is stripped, and a hand washing ceremony takes place to remember the servant nature of our Savior.

**6pm, Shawnee Campus:** Join us for a special Seder meal, as we celebrate the Passover the way Jesus and His disciples would have celebrated it. We will also see how Jesus changed this traditional meal, bringing it to fulfillment as He instituted the meal we now call Holy Communion. The Maundy Thursday Seder Meal runs from 6-8pm, and is a fully integrated experience, a combined time of worship and a full meal eaten together as the extended family of Christ. This year, instead of a potluck, we will be catering the meal to enrich the worship experience. ## Good Friday

This service commemorates the crucifixion of our Savior. As we journey with Jesus to the cross and remember His last words, we are reminded of the ultimate sacrifice that He gave for our salvation. Good Friday worship is actually the second part of the worship service that began on Maundy Thursday and that will conclude with Easter. The entire three-part service is known as the “triduum.” Thus the first portion of our Good Friday services has the feel of being “already in progress” as it begins with the Confession and Absolution in preparation for receiving Holy Communion.


