As springtime arrives and we get closer to Easter we will once again observe Holy Week which brings about the conclusion of the penitential season of Lent.

Very shortly after the beginnings of Christianity, followers of Jesus who lived around Jerusalem would gather and visit the places that had shaped the end of Jesus' earthly life. Over the centuries, this practice of remembering the last

days of Jesus' life spread throughout Christianityand it is this time of remembrance that we call "Holy Week." Holy Week recalls the events of the week that led up to the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ.

Over the years, this week has been considered the most important and holy time in the life of the church—especially what is known as the "Triduum"or Great Three Davs-of Maundy Thursday, Good

Friday, and Easter morning. Two thousand years later we continue this ancient and holy practice and many of the elements of our Holy Week worship have been used by Christians since at least the year 400 AD.

Please join us for our worship during Holy Week, as we contemplate the suffering, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ.







A New Way to Gift to Trinity


Give+ mobile giving app is now available to use from your smart phone.
