Trinity Youth Expectations for Behavior and Attitude:

The youth ministry Trinity

1. Youth Group(YG) participants are expected to conduct themselves as Christians living in the image of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. If a participant's behavior is found to be unbecoming of a Christian, their participation may be jeopardized.
2. All participants should treat one another with respect and love.
3. Appropriate language should be used.
5. Under no circumstances are Youth Group participants to consume or be in possession of illegal drugs/substances, or alcoholic beverages. A Youth Group participant found with any of these items may be expelled from the Youth Group activity and the proper authorities may need to be contacted.
6. YG participants should not be in possession of any kind of firearms or weapons. For LVR, this includes any knives, box cutters, etc.
7. YG participants should adhere to the meetup times and locations at camp and during travel.
8. YG participants should inform adult leaders of any disruption, accident or problem.
9. Ideas and enthusiasm should be shared!
11. Honesty, patience, trust, and forgiveness, should be given and expected by everyone.

I promise to uphold the expectations of our youth group and will do my best to always live in the image of Christ.

In the extremely rare situation of a student's behavior being found to be destructive to their LVR experience, or if they are unsafe at camp for whatever reason, the LVR leaders will send the student home early at the expense of the parents.
